The Comté Cheese Association is thrilled to announce its twelfth annual Comté Scholarship for American Cheese Society *Certified Cheese Professionals*[™] (ACS CCP[™]s)! This special scholarship opportunity is open to all cheese experts who have passed the Certified Cheese Professional[™] Exam. It gives CCPs the chance to win an all-expenses-paid trip to the Comté region of France to learn first-hand about the cheese's history and production, as well as to explore the Comté region and its culture. In addition, this year the winner will receive a \$750 cash stipend, which can be put toward ACS test taking fees and expenses.

To apply for the scholarship, ACS CCPs must submit an **entry form with a short essay by** <u>Friday</u>, <u>December 6th</u>, <u>2024</u>. This year's essay question revolves around how to convince a cheesemonger to add Comté to their cheese selection.
